DEGREES AND GRADUATES

Based on all graduates during FY10 – August 2009, January 2010, May 2010

SECTION ONE – Overview of Graduates

I. Total Degrees and Certificates Awarded¹

In FY10 CCCC awarded a total of 529 degrees and certificates, 43% were Associate of Arts degrees, 39% were Associate of Science degrees and 18% were certificates. The most common AA degrees were in Liberal Arts and Business. Among AS degrees the most common were in Nursing, Dental Hygiene and Criminal Justice. Among certificates the most common were the Paramedic Certificate, Medical Assisting Certificate, and the Massage Therapy Certificate.

II. Total Graduates Demographic Profile

The majority of 2010 graduates were female (66%) and students were predominantly white (84%). Other racial groups represented approximately 8% of the student body and 8% ethnicity was unknown.

SECTION TWO – First Year Out

I. Survey Process Used for One Year Follow-up on 2010 Graduates

The goal of the graduate survey is to follow-up on graduates and their employment and educational status, as well as to assess the graduate's overall community college experience.

The graduate survey was mailed to all graduates approximately one year after graduation. Graduates who did not respond to the mailed survey were subsequently contacted via email and phone. Of the 529 graduates 254 responses were processed. The 48% resulting sample is fairly representative of the overall student population; however, given the small number of respondents in many program areas, more specific information about programs may not be adequate for interpretation at the program level.

II. Where Are They Now?

A. Overview

Approximately, one year after graduation, 81% of those who responded to the survey were employed; 51% full-time, 29% part-time and 1% in military. In addition, 45% were continuing their education and were enrolled in school either full time (29%) or part-time (16%) and 36% were doing both concurrently.

B. Current Employment Status

Approximately 51% of the survey respondents were employed full time and 29% were employed part time one year after graduation. The percentage of students whose employment was related to their studies at Cape Cod Community College is 47%.
