1. **Course Number:** ENL100
Course Title: Reading and Reflection
2. **Course Description:** In this course students read, discuss, interpret, and write reflectively about a novel or non-fiction book. May be repeated for up to 3 credits.
3. **Student Learning Outcomes:**
Upon completion of the course, students are able to do the following:
 - Read, speak, and write cogently about the content, context, theme, and/or thesis of a work of fiction or non-fiction.
 - Examine and evaluate the ideas and underlying assumptions presented in a work of fiction or non-fiction.
 - Reflect on the ethical concerns raised in a work of fiction or non-fiction.
 - Relate the content of a work of fiction or non-fiction to current and historical events.

6. **Prerequisite:** ENL010 (Preparation for College Reading) or Reading Comprehension score of 50 and above.

9. **General Topical Outline (Optional):**
 - Students will read one substantial, sustained work of fiction or non-fiction.
 - Students will write reflective journal entries, papers, or essays in response to the work of fiction or non-fiction.
